



#### Rules of the Association

 The Executive Committee of the Union County Fair shall have the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and settle all matters in question and differences that may arise in connection with holding, managing or promoting the fair. The superintendents of each department will have charge of the department and all decisions are final.



- 2. In case of unfavorable weather or unavoidable cause, The Union County Fair Board has the power to postpone, continue, or call off the fair.
- 3. Judges decisions are final. A protest may be filed through the fair board's Executive Committee, whose decisions is final. To file a protest, a person must make it in writ- ing with all information and post \$25. The \$25 may only be refunded if the protest is sustained. Judges are not to judge a class in which he/ she has an entry.
- 4. No outside alcoholic beverages allowed on the fair grounds.
- 5. No motorized vehicles, except emergency vehicles, may be beyond the barricades after 5:00 p.m. Unauthorized vehicles may be towed.
- 6. Passes are issued to vendors renting booths or space during the fair, and are only issued after payment has been made to the vendor supervisor.
- 7. Every article exhibited during the fair will be under the fair's control until 3:00 p.m. the Sunday after the fair, but the fair will not be responsible for loss or damage that may occur. Animals and articles that are removed without the consent of the Executive Committee, or state inspector before the end of the fair will lose the premium award.
- 8. Entry fees, stall rent and exhibitor's tickets are to be paid for when entries are made. All entrants are required to leave complete, up to date addresses, phone numbers, and Social Security numbers in case premiums total over \$600. If an entry is made in the wrong class, the Superintendent of the Department or supervisor of the class may move the entry to the correct class for judging.
- 9. Exhibitors may enter any number of animals or articles in the fair, but not more than 2 animals or articles in the same class.
- 10. Junior livestock entries have separate rules listed in the Junior livestock section.
- 11. All livestock must follow the Illinois Department of Agriculture rules.
- 12. Every class with entries is to be judged, even with only one entrant in the class, and it will receive top placing in the class. If the judge deems the exhibit offensive or obscene, it can be disqualified, with a loss of the entry fee.
- 13. Department superintendents will receive materials for each class from the fair office before actual judging takes place, and then will promptly return the materials to the fair office for processing.
- 14. Exhibitors must personally sign the premium statement in the presence of a fair officer, board member or employee of the fair. A representative may be assigned for the person receiving the check. Proof must be shown as to the wishes of the exhibitor receiving the check.

Checks are to be picked up on the last Sunday of the fair from 1 p.m. until 3 p.m. in the office.

#### **Events:**

#### 1. Team Doctoring

Just like people the cattle can get sick and they need attention. There are vaccines and medications created specifically to keep the animal healthy and it is the cowboy's job to keep that animal in the best shape possible. As the cowboy recognizes a sick animal he must determine a treatment and rope that animal to give it medication. This event simulates that process and the animal is roped at the head and at the heels and a mark is applied to the animal's forehead. The fastest time wins.

#### 2. Wild Cow Milking

The ranching industry is based on cattle and raising calves to maturity and shipping them to market. When a calf is born they need the mother's milk to survive. Sometimes the mother's milk stops for some reason and the calf cannot get milk. Believe it or not sometimes the cowboy must check the mother cow for milk. This event is based on that premise. The cow is roped and a cowboy tries to squirt milk into a long neck bottle and must run to a circle. This event is a timed event and anything can happen. It is as wild as it gets! The fastest time wins.

#### 3. Team Sorting

A cowboy needs to have the ability to sort a certain cow or calf from the herd. It is a difficult process and it requires extreme concentration by the cowboy and his horse. They must react to the movements of the herd and be able to respond quickly to drive the cattle in the direction they want them to go. Team sorting simulates this process and requires the cowboys and their horses to sort numbered cattle from a herd and move them across a line. As you watch this event it may appear they are getting the cow to go where they want them to but in a fraction of a second everything may change. This event is very exciting and showcases the cowboy's and their horse's skills.

#### 4. Trailer Loading

Ranch rodeo trailer loading is how working ranch cowboys get the animal loaded into a trailer directly from the pasture. The animal may need to be loaded for market, transporting to a new pasture or for veterinary care.

#### 5. Ranch Team Roping

Team roping also known as heading and heeling is a rodeo event that features a steer (typically a Corriente) and two mounted riders. The first roper is referred to as the "header," the person who ropes the front of the steer, usually around the horns, but it is also legal for the rope to go around the neck, or go around one horn and the nose resulting in what they call a "half head." Once the steer is caught by one of the three legal head catches, the header must dally ( wrap the rope around the rubber covered saddle horn) and use his horse to turn the steer to the left. The second is the "heeler," who ropes the steer by its hind feet after the "header" has turned the steer, with a five second penalty assessed to the end time if only one leg is caught.

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

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#### Miss Union County Fair Pageant

The pageant for Miss Union County Fair will be held on Sunday, evening, August 21st, 2023, in front of our grandstand at 7:30 p.m.

The Miss Union County Fair Queen Pageant is held annually on the first Sunday night of the fair. Contestants compete for cash and prizes, including a Union County Fair Board sponsored trip to Springfield for the opportunity to compete with 70 other county fair queens for the title of Miss Illinois County Fair. Contestants must be between the ages of 16 and 21 and have not reached her 22nd birthday by January 1st of next year. Contestants must be a resident of Union County, have never been married, have never had a child and cannot be an adoptive parent. She may not have competed in another county fair pageant in this year and cannot be a former queen of another county fair. Each contestant will be judged in interview, speech, swimsuit, evening gown, and an onstage question.


Little Miss Union County:

Class H Rules and Youth Exhibits - Rules
All Junior livestock Classes follow these rules.

Junior livestock Rules

Superintendent - Paul Rich

NOTE: The Junior and 4-H horse and pony show will be Saturday, August 20, 2023, beginning at 9:00 a.m. in the horse show arena. Therefore, all horses and ponies must register between 8:00 a.m. and 8:45 a.m. in the fair office that morning.

Junior classes are eligible for premium State aid only if they are open to boys and girls who are 8 years of age or in third grade and not yet 21 years of age on or before September 1 of the year previous to the fair. All animals (i.e., individual, herd or flock classes) shown in junior classes must be the property of the boys and girls showing them. If the same animals are shown in both the open classes and junior classes, they shall be shown under the same exhibitor's name (for example, the father is not permitted to show an animal in the open class and the son or daughter to show the same animal in the junior classes).

- 1. Any youth living in Union County or any surrounding county may enter entries in the Union County Fair.
- 2. Each exhibitor will assume all risk for his/her exhibit.
- 3. Each exhibitor must present a completed exhibitor's entry form, with the entry fee, and health papers at the time of registration.
- 4. There must be an entry tag for each entry entered, except livestock. The tag will be secured at the

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- time of entering in the fair office. An exhibitor may enter a class only once unless otherwise stated. (See #11)
- Any youth that exhibits at the fair will receive a pass free of charge upon proof of exhibit. This pass is to be good for all days of the fair. This pass will be an arm band.
- No exhibit may be removed without presenting a claim check to the division superintendent, or permission from the division superintendent. The Auction Superintendent releases auctioned animals.
  - All checks for livestock will be made to Union County Fair. Payment must be made before superintendent can release animals. Sale checks will be distributed on Sunday, August 28, 2022.
- Division superintendents will act as supervisors of exhibits in all classes.
- 8. Animals must be in the possession and care of the exhibitor at least by June 1. Exhibitor must exhibit own livestock in sale ring, unless prior approval is obtained from the superintendent.
- 9. THE MANAGEMENT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO REJECT ANY EXHIBITS DEEMED UNWORTHY OR WHICH DO NOT CONFORM TO THE CLASS DESCRIPTION.
- 10. Decisions of the judges will be final in all classes
- 11. Each exhibitor may exhibit two entries in each class in Department H, but no more than two.
- 12. Cash all checks as soon as possible after the
- 13. Youths may not stay at the fairgrounds overnight without parental and/or adult permission and supervision.
- 14. Original health certificates for animals to be exhibited must be in the exhibitor's possession as animals are unloaded. \*Note health requirements on the state Department of Agriculture website.
- 15. Exhibitors must house their animals in the place designated by the division superintendent in charge. No blocking chutes allowed in side the barn without a superintendent's approval. Failure to do so will be considered a disqualification. For safety purposes, all aisles should be clear and free of equipment and supplies.
- 16 NO REFUNDS ON ENTRY FEES
- Registration papers or proof of breeding on purebred animals should be available for superintendent's inspection.
- The same animal may not be exhibited in more than one class, except in group classes.
- 19. The beef breeding classes have been divided into two categories, standard and exotic. The following are listed for references and are representatives of the categories but not intended

- to exclude those not listed.
- Standard: Angus, Beefmaster, Hereford, Sand Gertrudis, Shorthorn, etc.
- Exotic: Crossbred\*, Charolais, Limousin, Simmental,
- \*When one or both parents are of exotic classification.
- 20. Dairy crosses must be at least 50% dairy to show in the dairy class. The dairy cow class will consist of females that have had one or more calves.
- 21. Manure must be placed in designated areas
- 22. All animals shown at the Union County Fair must have water and feed at all times and "must be cared for and exhibited by exhibitor" or premium money will be withheld.
- 23. All exhibitors must follow the IAFE, or International Association of Fairs and Exposition National Code of Show Ring Ethics.
- 24. Animals not presented in the show ring at the time for the call for show will forfeit their right to show
- 25. All original health papers MUST be turned in at time of registration.
- 26. The meeting on Monday night at 5:00 p.m. is mandatory unless prior approval is given by the Superintendent of the class.

### LIVESTOCK AUCTION RULES

- Livestock Auction Rules must be followed at all times.
- 2. Weigh in will be at 5:00 p.m. Monday of the fair. Everyone will weigh in the animals at the same time and that weight will be final.
- Animals not making minimum weight standards of 900 pounds for steers, 210 pounds for market swine and 90 pounds for market lambs will not sell at auction on Thursday.
- 4. No breeding animals will be auctioned.
- Each exhibitor can sell one animal, unless they have multiple Grand Champions.
- 6. All market animals will be divided into classes of equal size, as possible.
- Animals will be sold in order as drawn by lots, with Reserve and Grand champion going last. The exhibitor will draw lots as they pick up entry materials on the first Monday of the fair at the 5:00 meeting.
- Sale weights of animals will be announced before bidding begins
- All sales are final, unless refused by the seller while still in the sale ring at the time of sales.
- 10. All checks for livestock will be made to Union County Fair. Payment must be made before superintendent can release the animals. Sale checks will be distributed to the exhibitors on the last Sunday of the fair. A deduction of 3

- percent of the sale price to be used for sale expense.
- 11. The Auction Superintendent releases auctioned animals.
- 12. All Grand Champion Animals must sell.

### IAFE

# (International Association of Fairs and Expositions)

National Code of Show Ring Ethics

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. this code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics", fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auctions proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibitions in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

- All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- 2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- 4. Animals shall be presented to show events when

they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with federal, state and provincial statues, regulations and rules effect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, or blood or other substance tested by the approved laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collections and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis or the sample are correct and sample take from the animal in question and correctly reflects the conditions of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or live stock show.

At any time after an animal arrives at the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and or medications shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

- 5. Any surgical procedures or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
- 7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management or their exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during or after the competitive event is

prohibited. IN the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.


9. The application of this code of ethics provide for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.


10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair of livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.

11. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.











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
